# HOLIDAY RECIPE Pumpkin Pie

If you don't know how to make pumpkin pie, you can follow this recipe. You should do this recipe because it's easy and it tastes great.

These are the ingredients you will need

3/4 cup of sugar

1 teaspoon of ground cinnamon

1/2 teaspoon of salt

1/2 teaspoon of ground ginger

1/4 teaspoon of ground cloves

2 large eggs

1 can (15 oz.) LIBBYS 100% pure pumpkin

1 can (15 oz.) NESTLE CARNATION evaporated milk

1 unbaked 9-inched (4- cup volume) Deep dish Pie shell Whipped cream

MIX sugar, cinnamon, salt, ginger, and the ground cloves into a small bowl. Beat eggs in a large bowl. Stir. Add pumpkin and the sugars and spices gradually. Stir in evaporated milk.

POUR the filling into pie shell.

#### BAKE:

Preheat oven 425°F. Put pie in for 15 min. Then reduce heat to 350F. Then put it in for 40 to 50

minutes until knife inserted comes out clean. Cool on wire rack for two hours. Serve immediately or refrigerate it. Top the pie with whipped cream.

There may be a lot of steps but that's what makes a delicious pumpkin pie.

**Q:** Is it going to be a class, if so who will teach it?


